In this issue of our Newsletter, we will discuss options for transporting a CCTR terrier to your home for a happily ever after. While the ideal situation is to find your new family member close to home, that isn't always possible, and the little one may have to pack their bags and go on a road trip. Flying on a plane in cargo is no longer a safe method, but most of our terriers are small enough to travel in cabin with a human escort. Many commercial companies now exclusively offer a ride for pets, and in some instances, a CCTR volunteer may be willing to do some of the driving to get your loved one closer to your home. Whichever way they get home, be rest assured that the terrier's safety will always be our number one priority and the method of transport will be determined by the needs of the dog.

In addition, this issue will update you on past fundraisers as well as upcoming ones, adoptions in April, and a sneak preview of our Annual Founders' Celebration month beginning July 1, which is CCTR's 501(c)(3) first birthday!

Enjoy and feel free to keep this valuable information as a reference in case you ever need to transport a terrier.

Transportation options can help you get your adopted terrier home

Not everyone falls in love with the person next door, and the same is definitely true for your next furever family member. You might fall in love with a terrier several states away and ask, "Is it really hard to adopt a dog from another part of the country?" The answer is that it's not hard, but it does involve planning and logistics.

While it certainly is easier to take a short car trip to pick up your new dog at its foster home, there are a variety of other options. Sometimes, the foster home may be able to meet you part of the way. If so, Cairns & Cousins Terrier Rescue will ask you for a \$.15 per-mile (round-trip) transport fee (which is not tax deductible). Not all foster homes are able to do this, and those who do are definitely going above and beyond the call of duty.

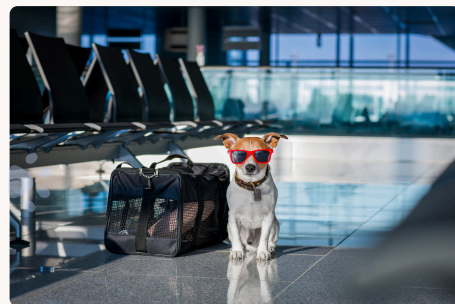

You also can arrange to fly to pick up your terrier and bring him or her back in the cabin. The costs may include (but are not necessarily limited to) the round-trip ticket for yourself, a one-way ticket for the dog that needs to be purchased when you purchase your ticket, and a health certificate that is required by the airline. This health certificate is time-sensitive, so plan accordingly with your foster home.



You also will need a specifically approved airline carrier; you can potentially borrow one from a friend or the foster home, or purchase your own. Be mindful that different airlines can have slightly different policies/approved carriers, so be sure to get a soft-sided carrier that is approved by your airline. And be sure to understand the weight limits for your airline as well (some airlines include the weight of the carrier in their restrictions, while others are more focused on specific dimensions of the carrier). And should your foster home meet you at the airport, expect to pay another transport fee (based on round-trip mileage, which is not deductible).



There also are some new carriers that allow you to travel with your dog in the seat next to you. (<https://retrievair.com> and <https://air.bark.co>, for instance.) They primarily focus on transport from big cities, but if you happen to be near one of their cities, it could be quite the introduction to the dog's new life!

Finally, there are some Pet Transportation Services that will arrange transport from the foster home to you. Costs can vary, and you are responsible for all. CCTR does not endorse any particular company, but we do reserve the right of refusal for the company you choose. Transports must not involve an overnight stop.

A recent CCTR adopter used a pet transport company to get her adopted dog home. One of our volunteers described what the adopter thought about the transport.

"She was so positive and enthusiastic about the owner of the company and the woman who drove her Emma the 600 miles – the experience was wonderful for the Mom. It solved a major problem for her and allowed her to get the fur baby she really wanted. She is really happy with the whole experience."

While it's certainly easier to fall in love nearby, don't limit yourself to an easy drive as options abound!
